UNDERGROUND UTILITY SURVEY

Have you ever had an Underground Services Survey and wondered what's that unidentified service running right through my site? Does it actually exist? Well that was the question we were asked over in Lincoln. Trial pits found land drains, the usual clay one and then a slightly more unusual triangle shaped one made out of stone! It was towards the end of the 18th century when they started to use clay tiles, so it's possible it may predate that. Drainage was an expensive business back then particularly as in 1784 the government put a tax of 5/- per thousand pipes.
