RUDYARD LAKE SITE VISIT

The reservoir was constructed by the Scottish civil engineer John Rennie in 1797 to feed the Caldron Canal and became a leisure destination in the early 1800's, the arrival of the railway in 1849 marking the start of the village heyday and by the end of the 19th century crowds of over 20,000 people could visit the lake on some days. Visitors included a John Lockwood Kipling and Alice Macdonald, who liked the place so much they named their son after the lake. The writer Rudyard Kipling author of the jungle book. The area is renowned for its beauty and had seen a resurgence in visitors in the 21st Century.
